



#### **HOLIDAY COOKIE RECIPES**

#### by Nancy Grasso

#### **CrackerJack Cookies**

Cream together: 1 cup butter, 1 cup brown sugar, 1 cup white sugar. Next add 2 eggs & 2 teaspoons vanilla extract. Mix in 1 & 1/2 cups flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon baking soda. Stir in 2 cups oats, 1 cup coconut flakes, 2 cups Rice Krispies. Preheat oven 350°, drop by teaspoons, 2 inches apart on ungreased sheets. Bake 10-12 minutes. Let cool 1 minute on sheets before removing them to racks to cool completely.

#### **Bakery Sprinkled Cookies**

Cream together: 2 sticks butter, 4 ounces cream cheese, 1 & 1/4 cups sugar, 1 egg, 1 teaspoon vanilla . Gradually mix in 3 cups flour, 1 teaspoon baking soda, 1/4 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt. Chill dough about 15 minutes. Place sprinkles in a bowl, shape dough into small balls & roll in sprinkles. Place cookie balls on baking sheet, gently use a glass to press these balls into circles. Bake at 350° for 10-12 minutes

#### Kichel (Bow Ties)

Beat together for a full 5 minutes: 5 large eggs, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract, 2/3 cup vegetable oil, 1 teaspoon sugar. Next mix in 2 & 1/3 cups flour & 1 teaspoon salt. Let dough rest, covered for 1 hour.

Spread 1 cup sugar on your counter to roll dough into a rectangle shape 1/8" thick. Cut into shapes approximately 2 inches long by 3/4" wide. Twist into the middle to create bow tie shape. Bake at 350° for 25-30 minutes. **ENJOY!** Nancy

### **A Veteran's Day Story**

This is a wonderful, *true* story. Since we are celebrating our Armed Forces November 11th, this is so apropos. It shows the strength and determination of those that will never give up!

It happened every Friday evening, almost without fail, when the sun resembled a giant orange and was starting to dip into the blue ocean.

Old Ed came strolling along the beach to his favorite pier.

Clutched in his bony hand was a bucket of shrimp. Ed walks out to the end of the pier, where it seems he almost has the world to himself. The glow of the sun is a golden bronze now.

Everybody's gone, except for a few joggers on the beach. Standing out on the end of the pier, Ed is alone with his thoughts...and his bucket of shrimp.

Before long, however, he is no longer alone. Up in the sky a thousand white dots come screeching and squawking, winging their way toward that lanky frame standing there on the end of the pier.

Before long, dozens of seagulls have enveloped him, their wings fluttering and flapping wildly. Ed stands there tossing shrimp to the hungry birds. As he does, if you listen closely, you can hear him say with a smile, 'Thank you. Thank you.' In a few short minutes the bucket is empty. But Ed doesn't leave. He stands there lost in thought, as though transported to another time and place.

When he finally turns around and begins to walk back toward the beach, a few of the birds hop along the pier with him until he gets to the stairs, and then they, too, fly away. And old Ed quietly makes his way down to the end of the beach and on home.

If you were sitting there on the pier with your fishing line in the water, Ed might seem like 'a funny old duck,' as my dad used to say. Or, to onlookers, he's just another old codger, lost in his own weird world, feeding the seagulls with a bucket full of shrimp.

To the onlooker, rituals can look either very strange or very empty. They can seem altogether unimportant .....maybe even a lot of nonsense.

Old folks often do strange things, at least in the eyes of Boomers and Millennials.

Most of them would probably write Old Ed off, down there in Florida ... That's too bad. They'd do well to know him better. His full name: Eddie Rickenbacker. He was a famous hero in World War I, and then he was in WWII. On one of his flying missions across the Pacific, he and his seven-member crew went down. Miraculously, all of the men survived, crawled out of their plane, and climbed into a life raft.

Captain Rickenbacker and his crew floated for days on the rough waters of the Pacific. They fought the sun. They fought sharks. Most of all, they fought hunger and thirst. By the eighth day their rations ran out. No food. No water. They were hundreds of miles from land and no one knew where they were or even if they were alive.

Every day across America millions wondered and prayed that Eddie Řickenbacker might somehow be found alive. The men adrift needed a miracle. That afternoon they had a simple devotional service and prayed for a miracle. They tried to nap. Eddie leaned back and pulled his military cap over his nose. Time dragged on. All he could hear was the slap of the waves against the raft...suddenly Eddie felt something land on the top of his cap. It was a seagull!

Old Ed would later describe how he sat perfectly still, planning his next move. With a flash of his hand and a squawk from the gull, he managed to grab it and wring its neck. He tore the feathers off, and he and his starving crew made a meal of it - a very slight meal for eight men. Then they used the intestines for bait. With it, they caught fish, which gave them food and more bait....and the cycle continued. With that simple survival technique, they were able to endure the rigors of the sea

until they were found and rescued after 24 days at sea.

Eddie Rickenbacker lived many years beyond that ordeal, but he never forgot the sacrifice of that first life-saving seagull...

And he never stopped saying, 'Thank you.' That's why almost every Friday night he would walk to the end of the pier with a bucket full of shrimp and a heart full of gratitude.

PS: Eddie Rickenbacker was the founder of Eastern Airlines. Before WWI he was race car driver. In WWI he was a pilot and became America's first ace. In WWII he was an instructor and military adviser, and he flew missions with the combat pilots. Eddie Rickenbacker is a true American hero. And now you know another story about the trials and sacrifices that brave men have endured for your freedom.

As you can see, I chose to pass this story along as it was passed to me. It is a great story that many don't know...I think it exemplifies a couple of life's lessons to be remembered. You've got to be careful with old guys, you just never know what they have done during their lifetime. It also speaks to me about how we never know what adversity we might face, but when we put our talent both mentally and physically together, we can overcome, but we must never forget what we learned and to remember to thank those that helped pull us through even if it was just something seemingly meaningless as a seagull and to pay it forward.

#### **Fall Prevention** by. Nancy Grasso

Did you know that 95% of hip fractures are from falls, therefore preventable? Don't forget about concussions, falling accounts for 60% of those.

Here's some basics to keep in mind, even though we're all pretty much aware, reminders are still useful. Before I list home hazards here's one of my favorite funny sayings... "Take my advice please, I'm not using it."

- 1) Remove hazards: clutter. (Shopping bags, boxes, shoes on the floor)
- 2) Remove loose scatter rugs. Did you know for public places it's in the ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act)? Section 302.1 and 302.2 Carpets must be securely attached.
- 3) Use lights. Automatic Plug-in Sensor Night Lights are an ideal solution to improve safety.
- 4) Wear sensible shoes in the house. Flip Flops tend to get caught on things a closed shoe can't, which increases the risk of falling. Ask me, lol I'm an expert on that!
- 5) Don't rush! Slower is safer, especially when getting up after lying down. Rushing around can encourage being distracted.
- 6) Keep often used items within reach.
- 7) Stay active! Inactivity leads to muscle weakness. Keep moving, consider Tai Chi, walking, water workouts. But be careful walking outside after a rain.
- 8) Strengthen your bones (vitamin D, sunshine, calcium, milk, broccoli, oily fish)
- 9) Get enough sleep and have your eyes & hearing checked. Speak with your primary care physician & know which of your medications could potentially make you dizzy.
- 10) If needed, install grab bars in your bathroom and don't shy away from using a walker or cane if it's helpful.

The alternative, loss of independence due to a fall, isn't fun! Not being able to do simple tasks (bathing, laundry, shopping) are troublesome! Lastly some additional causes of falls are worth noting. Inner ear problems, heart rate or irregular rhythms, dehydration, a drop in blood pressure & being tired are all worthy of consideration. Stay safe and focus on preventing falls.

#### The LEGAL CHIT- CHAT

Can you learn from the rich and famous?

MAYBE...OR MAYBE NOT. Just because someone has fame and fortune, it doesn't always follow that they think ahead....some may even believe that they are immortal. The powers that be have gone on record to say that there are three important estate plannings tips...1) Protect their wealth; 2) Ensure their legacy; and 3) Provide for their loved ones. That doesn't sound like planning tips exclusive to celebrities...aren't those things what everyone would want when they pass?

Making sure that your Estate is distributed to your intended beneficiaries is more than just writing a valid Will. There are a number of OTHER testamentary methods that one can transfer ownership of your assets [at the time of one's passing] that do not relate to distributions under the terms of a valid Will .... For example, an Individual Retirement Account, a pension plan, life insurance. When you have a valid Will it is equally important to revisit/review all of your beneficiary designations to make sure that they reflect your updated and current intention and desires.

When singer Prince died in 2016, he had no Will and a Minnesota Court was tasked with dividing his estate among his 6 siblings and half-siblings. It was further complicated by a Federal Inmate claiming to be the singer's son... his claim was later disproved; however it delayed the final disposition of the Estate in addition to costing avoidable Attorneys Fees to defend the matter.

When singer, Barry White died in 2003, he was in the middle of a divorce proceeding from his second wife. The court found he was legally married until the final divorce decree was signed resulting in his soon to be ex getting everything and his live-in girlfriend of several years and his nine children received nothing.

Remember that the above scenarios are "state specific"-- meaning that the state in which you permanently reside can and often does have an effect upon the validity of the Will that you have prepared for you -- and that outcome regarding the distribution of your Estate assets after you pass away, might not be what you intended or expected. Why take the chance. Procrastination is normal...not wise, but normal. Some people want to put off paying estate planning legal fees ... and guess what -- weeks become months ... until all of a sudden what you thought about doing was never accomplished.

At the beginning of the article I mentioned three important estate plannings tips...1) Protect wealth; 2) Ensure legacy; and 3) Provide for loved ones. I think it is important to add another important estate planning tips: Intentionally create an Estate plan that is clear and unambiguous, so that after you pass-away, your intended beneficiaries will avoid additional heartbreak, litigation and unnecessary costs and expenses.

The moral to the story...fame and fortune do not necessarily equal intelligent, thoughtful and careful planning. You wouldn't let a total stranger spend your money while you are alive.....why would you let a total stranger [meaning the state in which you permanently reside] decide under that state's laws how to divide and distribute your hard-earned money and other assets after your death?


